Project SAVE (Social Added Value of Employability)

The "SAVE – Social Added Value of Employability" project is a Strategic Partnership supported by the Erasmus+ programme. Six European partners (Italy, Germany, Slovenia, Spain, France) combine their skills and approaches to fully achieve the goals of the horizontal objective "common values, civic commitment and participation", through innovative training interventions for adults with low schooling, in order to trigger a virtuous circle between formal and informal education on the issues of global citizenship and social inclusion.

Low schooling is one of the main socio-demographic negative variables linked to inclusion behaviors and global citizenship. In particular, adults with a low schooling level are a target at risk of radicalization, that could lead to hate and xenophobia phenomena, especially in the current era of fake news.

SAVE project aims to design innovative training modules for adults with a low schooling on the issues of global citizenship and social inclusion.


Another goal is to improve the quality of the training offer for adults with low skills or qualification. Such improvement will be achieved including in the training courses a transversal

Starting from these themes and the methodological guidelines, we are now ready to imagine and design new training modules that teachers will be free to experiment in their training courses!

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INTELLECTUAL OUTPUT

The project includes 3 Intellectual Output:

IO1 - Methodology Vademecum

The Vademecum will contain the guidelines of potential activities and contents related to global citizenship, to be integrated into the training courses offered by the training agencies working with adults.

IO2 - Qualitative-Quantitative Assessment Toolkit

The Toolkit will help teachers/trainers to analyze the skills developed in the training courses designed and offered, enhanced with the global citizenship/social inclusion topics.

IO3 - User Handbook for the SAVE education model

The Handbook will be written after testing a training module containing the project's results. It will be shared and integrated with the training offers and methodologies applied by the training agencies.
